FUR LOVER Lindsay Lohan showed up for a red-carpet event in Paris yesterday and got a dusting of white flour from an animal rights activist.

The "Mean Girls" starlet wasn't hurt, and the powder was easily wiped off her black stole and blue sequined dress.

People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals said it didn't coordinate the stunt but applauded the vigilante. PETA has chastised Lohan for wearing fur in recent days.

"We have been in touch with her about this, sent her videos about about how animals are skinned alive for their pelts," PETA spokesman Michael McGraw told the Daily News. "But she

continues to wear fur, and that is upsetting a lot of animal lovers all over. Maybe a little flour dumped over her head will get her attention."

Lohan was getting out of a car in front of the swanky VIP Room on the Champs Élysées with her girlfriend, disk jockey Samantha Ronson, who was working a star-studded party there.

The dustup didn't deter Lohan from joining the party. She posed on the red carpet after the club helped her tidy up.

It's not the first time Lohan has made headlines with her penchant for pelts. She was sued by a Columbia student who accused her of stealing and then returning an \$11,000 mink.
